

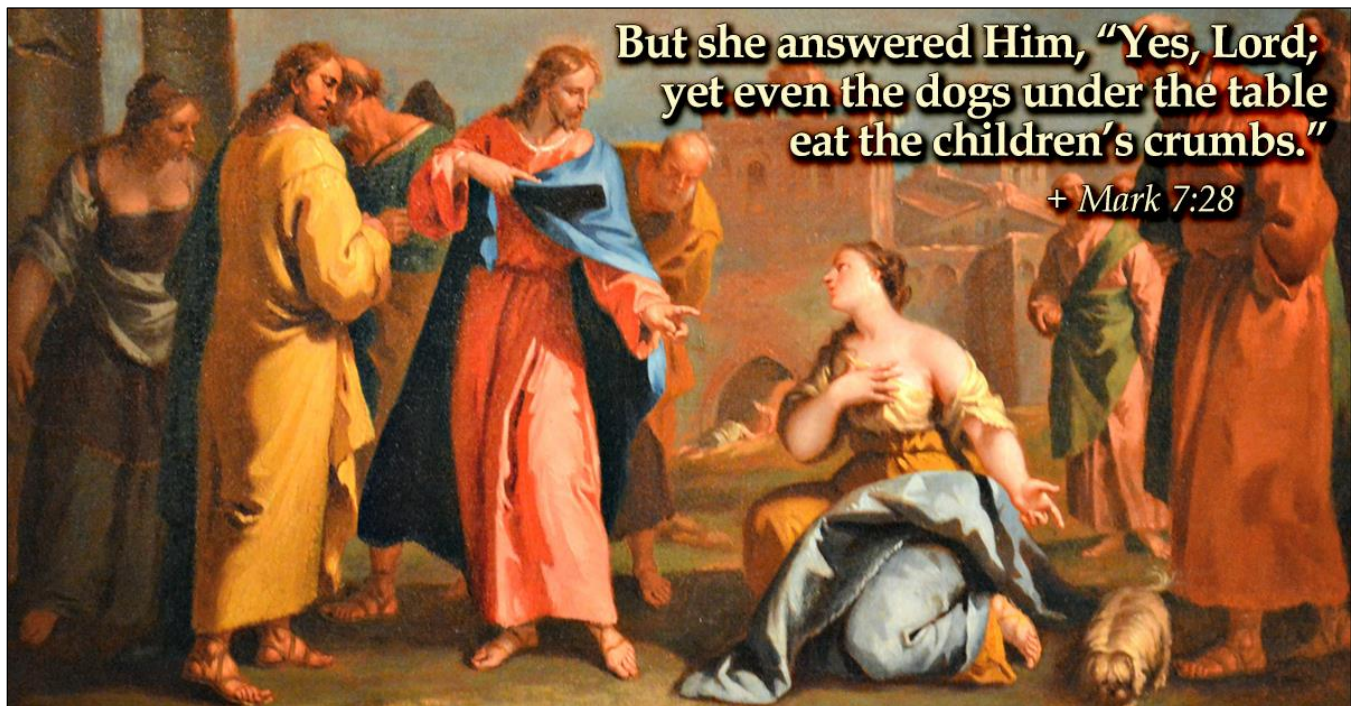

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Lord Hears his children as they cry for mercy. As He is our strong rock, we boldly confess with thanksgiving that His help is ever at hand (*Introit*). We humbly and expectantly lift our needs before Him, praying only that our petitions for mercy be answered “in accord with [His] gracious will” (*Collect*). God’s decisive action in His love toward humanity—the Father sending His Son, our Savior, into the world in humility and lowliness for us poor sinners—brings us His strength and a soothing balm to our anxious hearts and suffering bodies (*Old Testament*).

Saint James admonishes our Old Adam not to withhold mercy from anyone by showing partiality toward those with wealth, fame, and success at the expense of those who are downtrodden or impoverished. Instead, James reminds us that a living, saving faith in Christ will inevitably overflow with His good works (*Epistle*).

Christ, of course, is the icon of God’s grace in love and mercy. What man could never achieve, God has done for fallen humanity in Jesus: “Since mortals can no help afford, Place all your trust in Christ, our Lord. Alleluia!” (*Hymn of the Day*). Redeemed by Him, Christ powerfully works in and through us as we live out our daily vocations. Let us serve the Lord with gladness.

EPISTLE

James 2:1–10, 14–18

P The Epistle is from James, chapter two.

¹My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory. ²For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in, ³and if you pay attention to the one who wears the fine clothing and say, “You sit here in a good place,” while you say to the poor man, “You stand over there,” or, “Sit down at my feet,” ⁴have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? ⁵Listen, my beloved brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom, which He has promised to those who love Him? ⁶But you have dishonored the poor man. Are not the rich the ones who oppress you, and the ones who drag you into court? ⁷Are they not the ones who blaspheme the honorable name by which you were called?

⁸If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself,” you are doing well. ⁹But if you show partiality, you are committing sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. ¹⁰For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. . . .

¹⁴What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? ¹⁵If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, ¹⁶and one of you says to them, “Go in peace, be warmed and filled,” without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? ¹⁷So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. ¹⁸But someone will say, “You have faith and I have works.” Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works.

SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters,

We have been hard at work getting things ready for the move to Saint Louis. One major milestone has been getting an estimated move-out date from the moving companies. As it stands, that will be sometime the week of either October 10 or 17. With that in mind and so as not to leave Grace in a type of limbo (theological pun intended), **I believe it best to conclude my service at Grace as of Sunday, October 3, 2021.**

I have written to our church leadership to encourage them to contact our District Office and Circuit Visitor to help plan the next steps for Grace, and for one of the flock to step forward to begin scheduling and leading Congregational Meetings as you look to what God has in store for His people in El Centro. God has a plan for all of you! Never doubt that! You are not left as orphans—Jesus promised to be with you always, to the end of the age!

Now, let me tell you about the action-packed week her at home!

We finally brought in electricians to fix the electrical short that manifested after the air conditioning repair last September. Yeah, we've been without power to the main bathroom and the outlets in the kids' bedrooms for about a year.

I ran an extension cord along the floorboards from the guest room to power the sound machines for Leo and Sam so we didn't really NEED the outlets . . . at least not until we are getting ready to sell the house (who wants to buy a house with an electrical short, right?).

Turns out that the short was in the wiring that ran UNDER the concrete foundation! Oy! So . . . the electricians ran power all the way around the side of the house and brought it in from outside. It wasn't a big deal for the bedrooms but our bathroom had some pretty expensive rewiring (check out the picture).



Amidst all this, we've done the video walkthroughs for the moving companies to give us bids. They do all this through a video-chat on your cellphone and ask you to measure a few things here and there. Seamless and quick! Of course, we also got an estimated move-out date—either October 10 or 17. So that also means we hope to have our house sold BEFORE October 10. This means we need to get some property pictures taken and that means we need to pack up some of the extra stuff and get the home ready to show! EEEK! (Have I mentioned I hate moving?)



Yes, we've been busy but we still make time to have some fun at home. Sam and I played in the "ball pit" that Leo made for him (it's a pop-up play tent that Leo packed with every bouncy ball in our house—Sam LOVES it!). And Leo has been getting creative with towers of blocks (this one was almost as tall as him!).
