Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today's Gospel is from the holy evangelist Saint Mark . . . who seems to have forgotten all about Christmas! At least Saints Matthew and Luke talk about Mary and Joseph and the baby, and of angels and shepherds. But Saint Mark skips all of that by going all the way back to the Prophet Isaiah and, in the very next sentence, all the way forward to an adult John the Baptizer, preaching in the wilderness outside Jerusalem.

Even though Christmas doesn't *actually start* until December 25, the world is in "Christmas mode" already (sometimes even before the Halloween candy is moved to the discount section of the store). But Saint Mark drops into all this festive planning (or hectic preparation) with the Baptist's call—"Prepare the way of the LORD, make His paths straight"—"proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" (Mark 1:3b-4).

He is saying, "Stop what you're doing. Repent and welcome the Greater One, Jesus Christ, the Son of God." The Christian faith and life is one of repentance and faith. In the words of Martin Luther: "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said 'Repent,' He intended that the entire life of believers should be repentance."



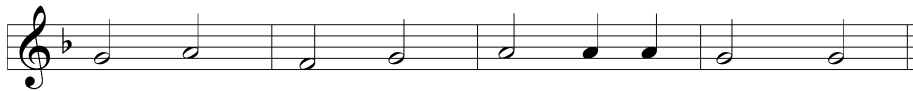



SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters,

Normally my final thoughts are light-hearted or even a bit silly. But today I'm digging out the old "soap box." Christmastime, as the world marks it, starts as soon as the last dollop of mashed potatoes are scraped from the bowl at Thanksgiving . . . if not even earlier nowadays.

And this "Christmastime" is all about entertaining—and I mean this in all its senses: entertaining our senses with foods and smells, entertaining our ears with jingles and songs about reindeer and elves and falling snow, entertaining our eyes with the latest Hollywood (or Netflix) blockbuster, entertaining of fleshly desires for gadgets and toys and expensive gifts galore (I even saw one car commercial that was all about *rewarding yourself* with a fancy new car).

Now before you paint my face green and call me a "Christmastime Grinch," let me just say that a little entertainment is a-o-k . . . and this year we need it a bit more than perhaps in years past (pandemic lockdowns and all that). I'm all for fun little movies and catchy tunes (even if Jesus isn't mentioned at all). And this isn't another "Keep Christ in Christmas" rant (which, of course, is absolutely essential).

Truth is, this isn't just a "Christmastime" problem. What we see and experience this time of year is just a symptom of the greater problem: *the need to be entertained and entertaining*. And this desire has been creeping into the church—not just today, but ever since the days of Adam and Eve.

There is simply no way that church can be fun and entertaining enough to keep our children interested; just as there is no way that church can be fun and entertaining enough to keep *ourselves* interested. And if entertainment and excitement is all that your church is doing, then it isn't really church—likely it is more a concert interspersed with some motivational speaking.

Church is about hearing God's Word—having Him speak His words to us and we, in faithful response, speaking those words back to God. The liturgy of the church is about catechesis (the fancy word for teaching the faith) and this word literally means "to sound back" (speaking back to God what He has first spoken to us). Take a moment to look at the liturgy in the Lutheran Service Book and see how nearly everything spoken comes from Holy Scripture!

Faithful church attendance, like so many Christian virtues, is a habit—one that must be practiced and reinforced each week, day, and moment of our lives. *And right now, faithful church attendance might mean getting up and "tuning-in" on Facebook!* And that is okay (not ideal, granted, but it is 2020).

It is a fool's heart that thinks our faith can be so secure that we a) will always love and want to come to church, no matter the circumstance, or b) start to think that we don't need church—the gathering of the body of Christ—or the study of His Word. Of course, this is why we call it "practicing the faith" because, this side of glory, our faith will never be perfect. That's also why Holy Scripture calls Jesus the "founder and perfecter of our faith" (Heb 12:2).

I hope you will join me in practicing our good Christian habits and drop in each **Tuesday at Noon (ending by 1:00pm)** for our **Advent Bible Study** on "Zoom." We socialize for the first 15 minutes and work through the psalm from 12:15pm to 12:45pm, finishing by 1:00pm.
