## SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters,

Whew! It was quite a week visiting Saint Louis, Missouri! With the time-change and some jet-lag, my poor kiddos are tuckered-out! Sam didn't sleep on the flight TO Saint Louis but he sure passed-out on the flight BACK to El Centro!

I think the highlight of our trip for Leo and Sam was the visit to "Magic House" (a sort of children's museum with multiple floors and tons of rooms filled with different experiences to engage in science, art, and good old-fashioned play). We were treated to the experience by our former pastor from Denver, Colorado, Rev. Michael Meyer and his family (Pastor Meyer baptized and confirmed Holly, and conducted the blessing of our marriage back at our then-home-congregation). Rev. Meyer now serves as the Director of Disaster Training for the synod.



However, the second-best thing was our trip to the West County Center (what used to be call a "mall") where Leo and Sam got to run-free in the play area. Sam was ecstatic to be stomping around with his big brother! And I caught a smile of pure joy on Leo's face while he rode in a fire engine!

This was also a chance for Mom and Dad to sit down (sort-of—we had to keep Sam from making a break for it into the mall) and talk about the trip and the Divine Call to KFUE.

**Brothers and Sisters, after much prayer and wrestling with God, I believe He has called me to serve Him in a new capacity as the Mission Advocate with KFUE Radio in Saint Louis, Missouri.** To this very moment, it still pains me to recognize that this means I must depart from this flock—from all of you, whom I love and for whom it has been my privilege, honor, and responsibility to serve as Christ's undershepherd. I love you all!

After informing Gary Duncan, the KFUE Executive Director, that I have accepted God's Call to KFUE, I took Leo with me into the Chapel at the LCMS International Center to explain to him what would be happening. We sat together in the back row of the chapel in silence for a few moments before I told him that we would be moving to Saint Louis and that I wouldn't be the pastor of a congregation—of our congregation—any longer, but that he and I and Mom and Sam would all together be ministered to by a pastor at a church in Saint Louis. As I spoke those words—as I came to the full realization that I wouldn't be your pastor anymore—I began to cry. Perhaps this was unwise—to burden such a little guy with his father's tears—but Leo's response was the last thing I ever expected: Leo stood up and looked at me very seriously and said, **"Dad, if you're sad, I'm gonna give you a surprise EVERY DAY to make you happy."** Well, you know I was crying even harder then, so Leo gave me a big hug and hung on to me for at least three minutes! And with that, I really did feel better.

Now, I realize you must be asking "What does this mean?" or "What happens next?" Well, in short, I am still your pastor until I and my family pull out of our driveway for the last time. We will continue to have Divine Service every Sunday and our Bible Study every Tuesday and our Prayer Service every Wednesday. I do not have a firm date when we shall depart—there are so many logistical hurdles that need to be cleared—but KFUE has asked that I make every effort to begin my service in October of this year. The church leadership and I will be working together to facilitate the transition to what is next but remember this: Christ Jesus is with you always, just as He promised!

In the time that we have left together, I truly hope to see you for our **study of the Psalms every Tuesday at Noon on "Zoom."** This week we'll be **studying Psalm 52.** And I would love to have you tune-in or come by the church for our **prayer service on Wednesday at 7:00pm.**
