THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as "Good Shepherd Sunday" so, quite naturally, the *Psalm* for today is Psalm 23. While we do not always sing the additional psalm option in *Matins*, today it seems silly not to do so. Along with the *Gospel* from John 10(:1–10), the focus is on the Lord, who is our Shepherd. The *First Reading* from Acts 2(:42–47) doesn't actually use the shepherd imagery but the theme remains—the Good Shepherd has gathered the sheep who hear His voice in the flock of His Church.

This Sunday accents the fact that God has raised the Shepherd who was slain to rescue His sheep. Death has no dominion over Him *nor over those who hear and trust in His voice*. Our risen Lord feeds, protects, and guards His sheep who are gathered in His name, and He leads them out of death into life everlasting.

This day's chief prayer, known as the *Collect* (because it "collects" the theme and readings of the day into one prayer), summarizes this truth beautifully: "Since You have wakened from death the Shepherd of Your sheep, grant us Your Holy Spirit that when we hear the voice of our Shepherd we may know Him who calls us each by name and follow where He leads."
