THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

March 21, 2021

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Over the years, various symbols have come to represent each of Jesus’ twelve apostles—emblems that remind us of an aspect of their life. The symbol often used for Saint John, one of the sons of Zebedee, is a chalice with a serpent in it.

This unflattering symbol comes from today’s Gospel, where John and his brother James ask to sit at Jesus’ right and left hands. Jesus responds, “The cup that I drink you will drink” (Mark 10:39a).

John does not understand what He asks for. But in time he will see that Jesus will drink from the cup of suffering, the cup of death, the cup filled with the sin of the world—because it is the will of the Father.

Thanks be to God that Jesus drank this cup for John and for us to give us forgiveness, life, and salvation.

Hebrews 5:1–10

P The Epistle is from Hebrews, chapter five.

¹Every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. ²He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. ³Because of this he is obligated to offer sacrifice for his own sins just as he does for those of the people. ⁴And no one takes this honor for himself, but only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

⁵So also Christ did not exalt Himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by Him who said to Him,

“You are My Son,
today I have begotten You”;

⁶as He says also in another place,

“You are a priest forever,
after the order of Melchizedek.”

Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?” ³⁹And they said to Him, “We are able.” And Jesus said to them, “The cup that I drink you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized, ⁴⁰but to sit at My right hand or at My left is not Mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.” ⁴¹And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. ⁴²And Jesus called them to Him and said to them, “You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. ⁴³But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many.”


