The motto of the Lutheran Reformation is “*Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum* (The Word of the Lord Endures Forever).” The letters VDMA were engraved in churches and doorways, on the banners, flags, and uniforms of Lutheran princes, and in homes of Lutheran families. It is taken from 1 Peter 1:24–25 where Saint Peter quotes the verse for today in Isaiah 40:8.

In the Gospel, our Lord Christ Jesus tells us how God sows His Word amongst the nations and where it takes root, there the fruits of faith spring forth according to His good and gracious will. Moreover, God declares through His prophet Isaiah that “[My Word] will accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it” (Isaiah 55:11c-d). Thanks be to God that He has given us His Word, that we may hear it and hold fast to all His promises, especially His promise that we are His children who call upon Him in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks as we cry, “Abba! Father!”

Brothers and sisters,

And that got me thinking about hobbies. Back in Colorado, I used to play in a symphony orchestra with my brother (we both played the upright bass). I also used to golf (though it has been a solid decade since I last played).
