**First Reading**

1 Kings 8:46–52

<sup>46</sup>“If they sin against You—for there is no one who does not sin—and You are angry with them and give them to an enemy, so that they are carried away captive to the land of the enemy, far off or near,  
<sup>47</sup>yet if they turn their heart in the land to which they have been carried captive, and repent and plead with You in the land of their captors, saying, ‘We have sinned and have acted perversely and wickedly,’  
<sup>48</sup>if they repent with all their mind and with all their heart in the land of their enemies, who carried them captive, and pray to You toward their land, which You gave to their fathers, the city that You have chosen, and the house that I have built for Your name,<sup>49</sup>then hear in heaven Your dwelling place their prayer and their plea, and maintain their cause<sup>50</sup> and forgive Your people who have sinned against You, and all their transgressions that they have committed against You, and grant them compassion in the sight of those who carried them captive, that they may have compassion on them<sup>51</sup>(for they are Your people, and Your heritage, which You brought out of Egypt, from the midst of the iron furnace).<sup>52</sup>Let Your eyes be open to the plea of Your servant and to the plea of Your people Israel, giving ear to them whenever they call to You.”

## Second Reading

Hebrews 12:3–11

<sup>3</sup>Consider Him who endured from sinners such hostility against Himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. <sup>4</sup>In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. <sup>5</sup>And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons?

“My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the LORD,  
nor be weary when reprov'd by Him.

<sup>6</sup>For the LORD disciplines the one He loves,  
and chastises every son whom He receives.”

<sup>7</sup>It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? <sup>8</sup>If you are left without discipline, in which all have participated, then you are illegitimate children and not sons. <sup>9</sup>Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? <sup>10</sup>For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but He disciplines us for our good, that we may share His holiness. <sup>11</sup>For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

## Holy Gospel

John 12:20–23

<sup>20</sup>Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. <sup>21</sup>So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, “Sir, we wish to see Jesus.” <sup>22</sup>Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. <sup>23</sup>And Jesus answered them, “**The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.** <sup>24</sup>Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. <sup>25</sup>Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. <sup>26</sup>If anyone serves Me, he must follow Me; and where I am, there will My servant be also. If anyone serves Me, the Father will honor him.

<sup>27</sup>“Now is My soul troubled. And what shall I say? ‘Father, save Me from this hour?’ But for this purpose I have come to this hour. <sup>28</sup>Father, glorify Your name.” Then a voice came from heaven: “I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.” <sup>29</sup>The crowd that stood there and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, “An angel has spoken to Him.” <sup>30</sup>Jesus answered, “**This voice has come for your sake, not Mine.** <sup>31</sup>Now is the judgment of this world; now will the ruler of this world be cast out. <sup>32</sup>And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to Myself.” <sup>33</sup>He said this to show by what kind of death He was going to die.

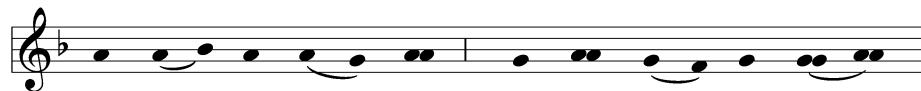

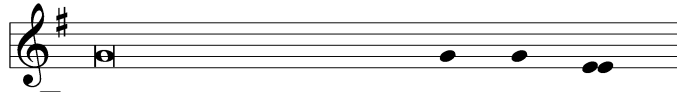

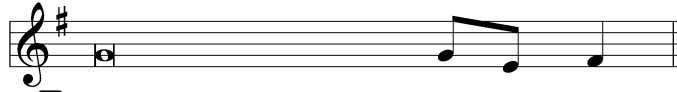
**L** Hear my prayer, O Lord;



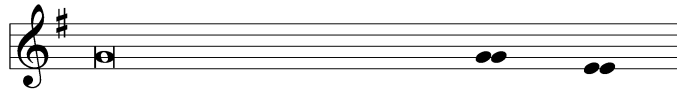

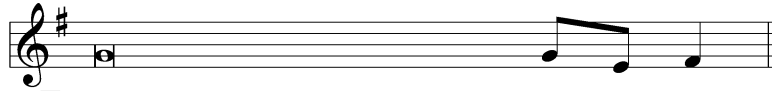


